The question as to how far we shall extend our electric line on the new road was discussed and motion prevailed that same be extended to a point opposite the small bungalow formerly owned by Lloyd G. Larimore.

The resolution as prepared by our Attorney, Mr. James M. Tunnell, Jr. relative to Certificates of Indebtedness under an act of the Lėgislature k/a Senate Bill #254, as amended, was read by Joseph L. Marshall and after discussion, motion prevailed that resolution be adopted as read;-

## RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS

WHEREAS, in the judgment of the members of the Board of Public Works of Lewes, there is need for improvements to the water system and electric system on the North Beach, at Lewes, the said required improvements being more particularly described as follows:

## WATER SYSTEM

Furnish and install water mains, necessary vales, and fittings on Lewes Beach on the following streets: Cedar Street, between Oregon Avenue and State Street, also on Cedar Street between Midland Avenue and State Street; also on New York, Connecticut, Delaware, Rhode Island, New Hampshire, Vermont, West Canal, East Canal, and Massachusetts Avenues.

Furnish and install fourteen (14) five-inch fire hydrants on the above streets.

Furnish and install a 200,000 gallon elevated storage tank on the southeast side of Cedar Street near Market Street.

Note: All of these installations are designed to furnish an adequate water supply and adequate fire protection for the section of Lewes known as "North Beach".

## ELECTRIC SYSTEM

Furnish all materials and labor to convert the electric distribution system into a three-phase system from South Street to Roosevelt Inlet.

AND WHEREAS, under an act of the Legislature known as "Senate Bill No. 254, As Amended", which was enacted into law on the 4th day of April, 1947, authority is given for a

bond issue not exceeding Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00), the proceeds of which may lawfully be used for such improvements as are hereinabove set forth;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it Resolved that the Board of Public Works of Lewes hereby formally approves the issuance of bonds for the above purpose in the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00), and hereby formally requests Commissioners of Lewes, a municipal corporation of the State of Delaware, to proceed at once with a referendum as provided for in said act, and if the result of the referendum be favorable, thenceforth to proceed with the preparation and sale of said bonds so as to make the money available to the Board of Public Works for the purposes above specified.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, the following bills were ordered paid, when properly ok'd:-
